## **A letter from Norman Hardy and John Bashford – the Tree Wardens for Great Staughton**

Both John and I still do what we can for the good of our village. I personally have been involved for over 16 years. I have collected seed from ancient woodland such as Monks wood so that the tree nursery in Godmanchester could grow them on for distribution throughout Huntingdon.

Both John and I used to go on work parties in Godmanchester to transplant and prune the trees as they grew, and prepare them for distribution for other wardens. This was over and above the work we have done in the past to our lovely village!

I have walked round the River Kym for over 26 years, and when I first arrived in the village the river had every type of fish in it from minnows, dace, roach, perch, pike, chub and trout, otters and water voles. The river had fallen trees in it and every bend had a water hole or reserve varying in depth from one to seven inches so if pollution of any sort went down river the water animals had somewhere to survive until the pollution passed.

About a year after I arrived in Great Staughton the water board dredged the river out, purportedly to help stop floodwater build up! 'But this river flash floods most people in the village don't realise this'. But as I used to walk my dog round it every day in the last 26 years I have been caught out three times. The first time I was approaching the road when water flowed past me, and when I turned there was a tide of water over both banks coming at me. I ran up the field towards the mill houses. Water was over my boots. My dog was a very big and powerful swimmer and he ended up at the road but the water could not get under the bridge and flooded over road. The dog managed to get on to the road where I met him. That was quite a frightening experience!

A month after the water board had dredged the river all the fish had disappeared - eaten by birds.

The river has never gotten over this as whenever trees fall in the river I think 'good. When it floods that will keep some water

back and encourage water holes to develop', but someone with good Intentions always complains and the river gets cleared – much to my annoyance. The river has become a wildlife desert. Just a few birds and not much of anything else. It needs some strategically-placed logs, some holes dug and fallen trees left, so when it floods the water is diverted over flood plain as it used to be! John and I feel like the proverbial mushrooms - the parish and county council keep us in the dark and pour on the dirt. I would like to thank Lord Duberly for the help he has given us in the past with trees. John and I put about 100 trees by the river from the footbridge to the Road, but only eighteen have survived.

We have discovered recently that an application to the county council has been made – something we both object very strongly to. The better place for the flowers would be where Mr. Hugh Stewart planted a selection of trees approaching the road bridge from the moor road. It would complement the trees and snow drops on the other side, and be in character with the approach to our lovely village! And why not put some on the side of the river where we have some of our surviving trees? People would get a very nice view of the fields - and even mushrooms could grow. While on the subject, could it be agreed with the water board to leave a meter from the brow of the river before any grass cutting transpires, then maybe people would get some wildlife back. I would be willing to advise what is needed, but at 83 I would find it difficult to work.

John and I are still willing to keep an eye on our trees, we just need some help from the middle-aged or indeed the younger community in the village.

Last but not least, John and I have seen several trees that need trimming before they cause problems. We used to do them ourselves but it is now beyond us. We need people to help before we croak it!

## **An update from the Chair of Great Staughton Parish Council on the Affordable Housing Project.**

The Planning process has been somewhat protracted as it was difficult to get agreement on the Section 106 requirements which accompanies the planning approval. As I write this an agreed format of the Section 106 has been reached with HDC, the CLT and Chorus Homes. It is now with the Parish Charities for final comment. The final version is clear in that it reiterates the requirement for the dwellings to be

allocated in a priority for local people. It is now hoped that this will all be agreed and signed in time for planning permission to be granted before the end of May.

The leases are ready to be exchanged which will then proceed and following that the letting of the contract to develop. It is hoped that this can be achieved in early June. If this all occurs some minor site works may commence in June with more substantial works taking place once all the planning conditions are seen to be satisfied.

There has been discussion on agreeing the process of applying for a property either for rent or shared ownership. Any applicant must register on Homelink and ensure you have ticked the local connection box. Any applicant must decide if they are applying for shared ownership or for rent. There is no priority given to those who register early. The allocation of rented properties will not happen until 28 days before they are ready for occupation. This period will be considerably longer for shared ownership properties. Chorus have agreed to produce a draft process for circulation, this will now be in the July magazine.

## From Barren Rocks to Living Stones

My first published book relates to a teenagers experiences in Aden (South Yemen) at a time of extreme terrorism and the British evacuation.

Below is the 2<sup>nd</sup> excerpt from the book.

---

They walked past the main gate, through the masses of endless rolls of barbed wire, and the soldiers standing guard, and proceeded along the road. Walking along this initial road Eddie was to discover his first glimpse of the real world of Aden. He looked around him at the young children sitting on the side of the road, begging, crying out “baksheesh! Baksheesh!” It was not merely the sight of the children begging that caught his attention, but the condition of the children, which he had never witnessed before. They had no choice about being limited in their movement because each of the children had at least one limb missing. It was not so much important which limb, but... it was among amongst those who were at a stage of life when they should be enjoying the fun and laughter of childish games. This was something they would never be able to appreciate for themselves.

How each of them got the deformity was often left to speculation. Every morning an adult would be seen driving p and depositing the children near the military gates, no thought being given to a provision of water to drink in the midst of the heat which was something they

had to beg for. It was a lucrative position from a begging perspective. As the personnel passed they would find it difficult not to be touched with pity for these young unfortunate lives...

By early evening, having spent a full day under the hot eastern sun, the vehicle returned. The adult would inspect the money the children had. As they gathered for the drive home each of them hoped to hear the words “Tammam, tammam, good, good”. Like any young person in any culture they hoped for positive words of encouragement.

The “family” knew only too well just how much each one of these poor young children had been able to reap the financial rewards from the terrible deformity that had been thrown upon their young innocent lives. This was Eddies first taste of the Arab world surrounding him. It is a world that many of us would like to close our eyes to and wish it never happened, but it is still there!

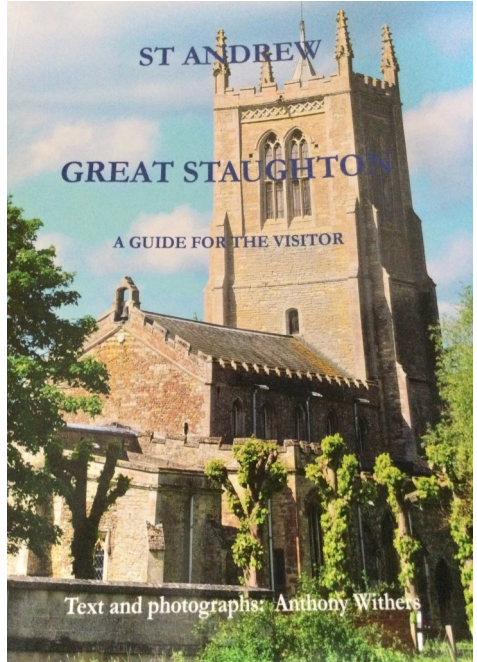

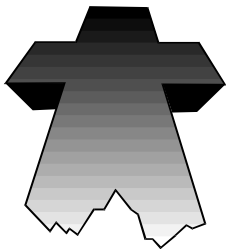

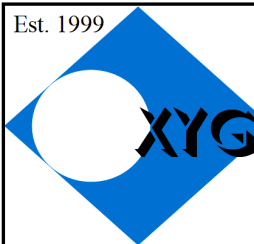
